THIRD MUSP FOREIGN MINISTERS' MEETING

U.S. Secretary of State Antony Blinken and Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister of the Lao People's Democratic Republic Saleumxy Kommasith co-chaired the Third Mekong-U.S. Partnership (MUSP) Foreign Ministers' Meeting (FMM) on July 27, 2024, in Vientiane, Lao PDR. The co-chairs convened the MUSP members to formally approve and adopt the MUSP Plan of Action 2024-2026 and released a joint statement to affirm the cooperative relationship between the Mekong countries and the United States. Thai Foreign Minister Maris Sangiampongsa announced Thailand would assume the role of MUSP co-chair in 2025. Key priority areas Thailand seeks to address as co-chair include digital economy and digitalization, tackling transboundary air pollution, and combatting non-traditional security issues including drug-trafficking, human trafficking, and online scams.

WE INSPIRE GRANT SHOWCASE EVENT

Implemented by Kenan Foundation Asia, the MUSP's Women Entrepreneurs (WE) Inspire program amplified its Thailandbased activities by hosting a grant showcase event in Chiang Khong on September 19 and identifying recipients for a new round of financial support. Nineteen women entrepreneurs and community business owners reported how they used the last round of seed funding to grow their businesses and delivered pitches on how they would potentially use additional funding. Ten businesses received between 20,000-40,000 baht (US \$600-\$1200) for additional inventory purchase, equipment purchase, or strategic market positioning branding, through e-commerce, certification. Two businesses that participated were owned and run by women from ethnic minority groups (Yao and Hmong) who highlighted that funding helped them preserve traditional arts in their respective communities.

"I'm very happy to have won the scaling grant—it feels like a dream come true. We started as a group of regular folks. Joining the project has allowed us to improve our product standards, and before, we didn't have a fish-drying facility, but now we do. And winning this new round of grants will enable us to have a proper packaging facility — I feel like we've been progressing step by step, with Kenan by our side from the very beginning. We have witnessed the improvement of our group. Even though the grant amount may not be huge, the sense of accomplishment is enormous. We want to be a role model and share our experience with others who aspire to start their own businesses."





"Before this, I had to manually mix the soil by hand. After receiving the first round of grants, I used it to buy a soil mixer, which has saved a lot of time and effort, helping the business grow significantly. However, when the floods recently hit Chiang Rai, I suffered heavy damage to my home, farm, and raw materials for the business, especially the soil that was completely ruined. Even though the water has receded, it will take a long time to recover, causing quite a bit of lost opportunities. That's why I feel incredibly happy and overwhelmed that the judges recognized the significance and awarded the scaling grant to me... If I get a storage facility (from the new grant), it will make mixing the soil much easier, faster, and more convenient, further helping my business to grow even more."

"This project has played a significant role in building my business knowledge, helping me understand both my strengths and weaknesses, and enabling me to truly improve my business. Coupled with the previous round of funding, I nearly doubled my profits from before. I believe that, without joining the training [from WE Inspire], I might not have been able to improve my business at all. As a Laotian with many restrictions living here, I am especially grateful to the project for accepting and providing equal opportunities to people of all nationalities."
